Unit 1:

Unit 2:

Telling stories. Simple Past (all forms). Regular and Irregular verbs.

Writing: Narratives. Use of tenses for narratives. Storytelling.

Vocabulary: Romance. Fiction. Stories. Historical Places. Multi-part verbs (particles: out, in, up, down). Wordbuilding. Prepositions: in, into, on, out of, to, at

Linking: one day, the next day, suddenly, after that, because, so, in the end, next, then, when.

Unit 3:

Talking about food. Exercise and healthy living. Illnesses. Countable and Uncountable nouns. *Some, Any, A lot of. Much* vs. *Many. A few, little. No, none, nothing.* Vocabulary: Food and drink. Containers. Physical activities. Prepositions of place: *at, on, in.*

Linking: But, however, therefore, although, in spite of, despite.

Unit 4:

Talking about sports. Describing sporting events. Modality (have to / don't have to, can/can't, Should / Shouldn't, Need to, Had to / Didn't Have To).

Vocabulary: Sports. Verbs. Equipment. Wordbuilding: Adverbs. Prepositions: *above, across, over, up.*

Linking: *after, before, during. After* and *before* followed by –ing forms.

Writing: Newspaper Articles.

Unit 5:

Talking about appearance and personality. The importance of fashion and image in society. Comparative and Superlative Form of Adjectives and adverbs. Irregular forms.

Vocabulary: Adjectives to describe appearance and personality. Materials. Clothes. Multi-part verbs (*up*, *off*, *for*). Wordbuilding (adjectives from nouns). Jobs and Occupations. Applying for a job. Fixed phrases (*a big break*, *of all time*, *a long time ago*, etc). Expressing opinions (*be for/against something*, *to agree/disagree*, etc).

Linking: either...or

Writing: Opinion pieces.

Reading: "The Old Man at the Bridge" by Ernest Hemingway.

Unit 6:

Talking about the future. Be Going to / Will, Won't. Present Continuous with future meaning. Contrast between different ways to express the future.

Vocabulary: voluntary work. Causes. Multi-part verbs (out, on, across). Specific vocabulary connected to email writing.

Linking: to, for.

Writing: Formal and informal conversations. Emails.

Reading: "The Fun They Had" by Isaac Asimov.

Unit 7:

Talking about machines, computers and science. Present Perfect (all forms). Regular and irregular verbs. Use of ever, never, just, since, for, already, recently, yet, still. How long...?

Vocabulary: Computers. Science. Machines.

Linking: firstly, secondly, maybe, too/also, finally.

Reading: "The Gift" by Ray Bradbury.

Different stages of reading, listening, speaking (esp. debates) and writing will be carried out in all the units.
